Services and treatment approaches include diagnostic testing, crisis intervention services, behavior therapy, individual, group and family psychotherapy, medication, and similar services. The child should be able to maintain sufficient stability in his/her existing support network to be treated effectively within the hours of outpatient treatment prescribed in the treatment plan. (Excerpted from Appendix T Part B(1)). Service is office based.

The services are provided for the purpose of improving and developing the capacity of the treated child or adolescent, and the family, thereby contributing toward the independence of the family as a unit. The needed services will vary according to severity of the child's problems and the richness of the resources of the child, the family, and the community (excerpted from Appendix T part B(2)).

**Level of Care: Summer Therapeutic Activity Program (STAP)**



Summer therapeutic activities programs (STAP) are available to children under the age of 21 with serious emotional disturbances based on individual needs of the child and medical necessity. STAP provides a wide range of age appropriate specialized therapies (defined as art, music, dance, movement, play, recreational or occupational therapies which require qualified staff and/or therapeutic activities (group, interpersonal relationships, daily living skills, decision-making, problem - solving and coping skills). (Excerpted from Bulletin 50-96-03). Programs and target populations vary from provider to provider. **Level of Care: MultiSystemic Therapy (MST) (Not a County MH-funded service)**

Family and community based treatment model that addresses the mental and behavioral health needs of youth aged 12 to 17 through utilization of a highly intensive clinical model. All interventions are evidence-based practices that create the increased likelihood of sustainable changes throughout the family system. MST also empowers the parents (caregivers) with the skills and resources need to become independent in addressing the difficulties that arise in raising adolescents and to assist youth in developing coping skills.

**Level of Care: Specialized In-Home Treatment Program (SPIN)**

Specialized in-home program to reduce sexual victimization by providing treatment services to youth who show sexualized behaviors and/or who are sexual perpetrators. The treatment team also provides education and support to family members to increase the level of support the child/adolescent receives (Excerpted from OMHSAS approved service description). **Level of Care: Multidisciplinary Treatment Foster Care (MTFC)--Cumberland County Only**

The primary goal of MTFC is to provide an alternative to custodial or residential care for troubled youth, having a history of disrupted care. MTFC provides adolescents with close supervision and monitoring, fair and consistent limits and consequences, a mentoring relationship with at least one positive adult, and a reduction in association with a delinquent peer group. The child or adolescent is placed in a private home where they work with treatment parents. The MTFC model uses a behaviorally based social learning theory approach, emphasizing positive reinforcement and encouragement to coach and support each youth in developing the individual skills necessary to achieve healthy adaptive behavior, improve family functioning, increase educational attainment and achieve more positive life outcomes across multiple contexts. All youth actively contribute to the development of his or her treatment goals. MTFC can also be used as a step-down from an institutional/custodial setting to reintegrate the youth into a community based setting. Program serves youth aged 12 to 17. Youth must be involved with county CYS and/or JPO offices. (excerpted from OMHSAS approved service description). Staff are trained in the theories and principals of Applied Behavioral Analysis. MNC is determined by using a matrix approved by OMHSAS. MNC for this program looks at four categories. The categories are: 1. Challenging or problematic Behavior, 2. Independint Functioning in Age/Context Appropriate Routines, 3. Group Functioning, and 4. Interpersonal and Social Skills.

Children typically have a diagnosis of autism or another mental health diagnosis. Staff members are trained/skilled in providing developmental services to young children and are certified by the Department of Education (Excerpted from OMHSAS approved service description). **Level of Care: Community Residential Rehabilitation Host Home (CRR-HH)**

A host home for children is a private family residence, other than the home of the child's parents, with whom the CRR Host Home Provider contracts to provide a structured living arrangement for one to three children (from 5310.6 definitions). Host home parents provide assistance with school work and school related activities, provide social and recreational activities, offer family support and training services which will allow the parent(s)/primary caregiver(s) of the child to identify social emotional needs of the child, use of appropriate strategies in meeting the child's needs and development of family interpersonal relationships. The goal of CRR Host Home is for the child to return to his/her family if this has been identified as a goal of the rehabilitative program (from 5310.121). The host home family will assure the child receives all necessary treatment while under their care. Children must meet MNC Criteria for Children's Services in Appendix T Part B. Numerous options exist across the state.

#### Level of Care: Partial Hospitalization

Partial hospitalization lies between the most restrictive and community based levels of care. A partial hospitalization treatment program offers a wide range of treatment in a setting segregated from the child's natural setting for part of the day. Effective treatment and stabilization of the child must be possible within the partial hospital program hours prescribed in the treatment plan. Partial hospitalization provides an opportunity to observe the child's behavior and the effects of treatment, designed for the effective reintegration of the child into the community. Partial programs are required to offer individual, group and family therapy as well as other services as required 3-5 days per week up to 6 hours a day. Member must meet MNC Criteria per Appendix T Part A. (Excerpted from Appendix T Part A).

**Level of Care: Substance Abuse ICM/RC**

Case management services vary in intensity (ICM/RC) but are individualized services targeted to persons with addictive disorders who have multiple and complex needs. The purpose is to provide support, advocacy and assistance in accessing needed services and resources. Activities include assessment, service planning, linking client to services, monitoring participation in services and assisting the person to develop a positive support network. (Source: Supplemental Service Description - Technical Assistance Manual July 2003). MNC is determined through the ASAM.

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**Child/Adolescent Services System Program (CASSP) Principles**

<p><b>Child-centered:</b> Services are planned to meet the individual needs of the child, rather than to fit the child into an existing service. Services consider the child's family and community contexts, are developmentally appropriate and child-specific, and build on the strengths of the child and family to meet the mental health, social and physical needs of the child.</p>
<p><b>Family-focused:</b> Services recognize that the family is the primary support system for the child. The family participates as a full partner in all stages of the decision-making and treatment planning process, including implementation, monitoring and evaluation. A family may include biological, adoptive and foster parents, siblings, grandparents and other relatives, and other adults who are committed to the child. The development of mental health policy at state and local levels includes family representation.</p>
<p><b>Community-based:</b> Whenever possible, services are delivered in the child's home community, drawing on formal and informal resources to promote the child's successful participation in the community. Community resources include not only mental health professionals and provider agencies, but also social, religious, cultural organizations and other natural community support networks.</p>
<p><b>Multi-system:</b> Services are planned in collaboration with all the child-serving systems involved in the child's life. Representatives from all these systems and the family collaborate to define the goals for the child, develop a service plan, develop the necessary resources to implement the plan, provide appropriate support to the child and family, and evaluate progress.</p>
<p><b>Culturally competent:</b> Culture determines our worldview and provides a general design for living and patterns for interpreting reality that are reflected in our behavior. Therefore, services that are culturally competent are provided by individuals who have the skills to recognize and respect the behavior, ideas, attitudes, values, beliefs, customs, language, rituals, ceremonies and practices characteristic of a particular group of people.</p>
<p><b>Least restrictive/least intrusive:</b> Services take place in settings that are the most appropriate and natural for the child and family and are the least restrictive and intrusive available to meet the needs of the child and family.</p>
